A Lot Can Happen in 40 Days

From September 22nd through October 31st, Dallas-area pro-life advocates will once again join together with people of faith and conscience across the nation for Dallas' sixth 40 Days for Life campaign. 40 Days for Life is an intensive, ecumenical pro-life initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, 40 days of peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and 40 days of grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history where God brought about world-changing transformation in 40-day periods.

40 Days for Life gets results because it invites the community to recognize the tragedy of abortion and emphasizes a call to prayer and conversion. Indeed, cities that have held these prayer campaigns, including Dallas, have seen abortion

Take a Stand for Life

As this newsletter goes to press, final plans are being made for more than 1500 cities and towns to have a **Life Chain on Sunday, Oct 3, 2:00 to 3:30 p.m.** Since many of the cities have more than one location, there will be a pro-life silent witness in more than 1800 locations across the U.S. and Canada.

Life Chains are listed on www.LifeChain.net. Professionally-printed signs are provided at each site during this prayer event in its 23rd year. Every year GCRW members may be found at about seven of the Dallas-area Life Chains.

Participants stand (or sit in lawn chairs) in silence holding a sign and praying for our nation, for people in crisis situations and for the sanctity of human life to be held sacred. Organizers are amazed at the overwhelming percent of positive response but ask their people not to interact with those passing.

Another ecumenical opportunity to stand up for life is **40 Days for Life from Sept 22 through Oct 31**. This is a peaceful vigil to save lives and change hearts through 40 days of fasting and prayer for an end to abortion. The Dallas location will be outside the Southwestern late-term abortion center at 8616 Greenville Ave at Royal Lane.

At this crucial moment in history, 238 cities across 46 American states, Canada, Australia, Northern Ireland, Denmark, and England will be in intensive 40-days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion. For more information, please go to www.prolifedallas.org/40days

centers close, abortion workers quit, women choose life, and consequently, hundreds of lives saved. This week in Dallas will begin the 24 hour/7 day a week 40-day vigil outside the **Southwestern late-term abortion center** (located at 8616 Greenville Avenue at Royal Lane (NE corner)).

The first 40 Days for Life campaign in Dallas involved a 24-hour vigil in front of Aaron's late-term abortion center, from December 12, 2004 through January 22, 2005. This vigil was extremely sacrificial – it was cold and took place over the Christmas season. God honored the sacrifice. Not only did Aaron's late-term abortuary close in August 2008, bringing the number of abortuaries in Dallas from six to five, but as you drive eastbound on LBJ Freeway between Preston and Hillcrest, you will see that the former facility where so many babies lost their lives has also been *leveled to the ground*, without even a trace.

Curtis Boyd, the abortionist who opened the first abortion center in Dallas, recently opened the Southwestern late-term abortion facility where babies are aborted up to 24 weeks (6 months) of pregnancy for any reason. Boyd, a former Baptist preacher turned Unitarian, admitted in a chilling television interview "Am I killing...Yes, I am. I know that." Boyd has estimated that he will perform approximately 2,000 late-term abortions each year; at \$3,000 each, the abortion center could bank 6 million dollars for late-term abortions alone this year. Responding to the particular horror of late-term abortions, Dallas pro-life advocates have chosen this abortuary to witness against the holocaust of abortion during the 2010 40 Days for Life campaign.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM VALUES VOTERS SUMMIT
 Sep 16-18, 2010 in Washington D.C. by Penna Dexter

I was privileged to attend the Values Voters Summit where over 2000 gathered at Washington D.C.'s Omni Shoreham Hotel. These are my impressions.... paraphrased highlights with a few quotes...from the speeches made the first full day of the conference, which just happened to be Constitution Day.

TONY PERKINS, President, Family Research Council – “The God we serve is greater than any problem we face.”

GOVERNOR MIKE HUCKABEE (Came in second in the presidential straw poll.) – The Tea Party has caught fire because there's a language problem: Government is unable to understand the language of the average, breadwinning American family.

We should not set aside the moral issues as some leaders are suggesting. In fact, the meltdown of Wall Street is a *moral crisis*. Also, it's not so much a fiscal crisis, but a *family crisis*. Poverty is caused mostly by the breakdown of the family. “God never intended the government to raise our kids. ”To great applause he spoke of the value of every human life.

Within five years “The public option will be the only option.”

SENATOR JIM INHOLFE, (R-OK) – The Democrats are trying to destroy every institution that makes America different, starting with the military.

SENATOR JIM DE MINT (R-SC) – “Power is shifting from government to the people.”

You cannot be a real fiscal conservative if you do not

understand the need to have a culture based on values. (For instance, currently we have creative incentives that encourage unwed birth.) “When you have a big government, you're gonna have a little god.” In the left's effort to purge religion from government, they've also purged the values.

REP. MICHELLE BACHMANN (R-MN) – On life: People have a right to life whether they're strong and fit or sick and old or yet to be born. **On liberty:** Thomas Jefferson said that when the government fears the people there's liberty. **On the pursuit of happiness:** Individuals have the right to the fruit of their own labors. People are reclaiming these inalienable rights.






The Tea Party is the largest political movement we have seen in recent history. It's needed because our leaders no longer reflect our values.

REP. MIKE PENCE (R-IN) (Won the presidential straw poll.) – This is the beginning of the end of the Pelosi-led Congress. We shouldn't get complacent about winning Congress back. We have to work hard.

“Democrats had their say the third Sunday in March. Republicans will have their say the second Tuesday in November.

Our crisis is moral, not just economic and political. We need to restore virtue and the institutions of life and family. Our government can't print enough money to pay for the repercussions of the collapse of the family.

GOVERNOR MITT ROMNEY – Obama used the financial crisis as a cover to push his economic agenda. This created uncertainty and made the crisis deeper, longer, and more painful.

Preparing for the "October Surprise"

The Pelosi-Reid-Obama regime has set themselves up for a really nasty October surprise of their own making and all of us need to be prepared for framing publicity of it properly (as the media will do anything **but** put the blame where it truly lies).

That October surprise is the annual benefits cycle of most companies. You see, the small company I work for is unusual in that its benefit cycle is Oct. 1, Not Jan. 1. And we all got stunned by the 40% increase in the cost of that. The company ate about 12-15% but the rest- and the new out-of-pocket costs are astronomical. Total costs (out-of-pocket and premium) to employees with families is going up from \$2,000 to \$4,000! That's a number that is triple anything ever seen before and the blame lies squarely on Obamacare.

The Tea Parties need to be out front on this one, advertising it NOW (not 'Chicken Little' like but something along the lines of "When

you find out what next year's benefits cost, be sure to thank those responsible for Obamacare at the polls.") Also, it would be a good time to get videos of Tea Partiers discussing that a lot of people will discover why we were so actively working against Obamacare when they get their costs on next year's medical benefits. We need to frame this early and often and the blood-letting of liberals on November 2nd will get total. This effort has to be national; expect the Libs to try to put it on 'evil insurance companies taking advantage'. That won't wash because competition for benefits is very tight now; our company shopped, but could do little better elsewhere.


Texas AG Rules Abortion Facilities Must Be Licensed to Perform RU 486 Abortions, May Not Use Recorded Messages for Informed Consent

Texas Alliance for Life News Release, 9/24/10

Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott issued two opinions regarding the practice of abortion in Texas

that significantly increase protections for the health and safety of women. In response to requests for opinions from State Representative Frank Corte (R-San Antonio), Abbott ruled that abortion facilities that perform medical abortions (using chemicals such as using RU 486 instead of surgical methods), must obtain an abortion facility license. Abbott also ruled that abortion facilities may not use a prerecorded telephone message to furnish information the law requires an abortion doctor to provide "orally by telephone or in person" to a woman 24 hours before the abortion, including the medical risks of the abortion.

"We are pleased with these two opinions because they are major victories in the struggle to require Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers to protect the health and safety of women," comments Joe Pojman, Ph.D., executive director of Texas Alliance for Life. "Attorney General Abbott has confirmed what common sense already tells us." (See <http://www.texasallianceforlife.org> for full story.)
